2018 was such a great year for Burnaby Community Services. With your support, we achieved *so much* and we are looking forward to expanding our horizons in 2019.

Through our Seniors Transportation Program, we launched our **1st Bus Program** where seniors are picked up from their homes, dropped off at select locations, then delivered back to their homes at the end of the day. We also launched the **BC211 Seniors Transportation Hotline,** and worked with ICBC on a **driver transitioning brochure, and Translink and Handydart workshops for seniors.**

We collaborated with the British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT) to start offering **Career Counselling for individuals with low-income**. This is part of a larger program that we are launching fully in March 2019, called **Bridging the Employment Gap**. Stay tuned!

And finally, we were awarded the **Not-For-Profit Organization of the Year** Award by the City of Burnaby and the Burnaby Board of Trade. What a year!


Words from a client-turneddonor
